



The Homecomers' Office

During the workshop, we focused on the part of Katarína Löffrelová's life when she returned home on 22 May 1945

Bratislava and began searching for her surviving family members. In the Homecoming Office's notice board, she can find people who are looking for their relatives, including herself.

Based on your life story, a form "Steckbrief" (Profile) is filled in by the students, with letters of reply and a short message to her uncle, informing them of her whereabouts and possible meeting points, and a short written account from an eyewitness of when and where they last met.

Pedagogical concepts: human rights, developing empathy, problem solving, developing written communication in a foreign language (German)

Duration: 45 minutes

Levels: 7-8th grades, language level A2-B1

Group number: 10-15 persons

Necessary materials: cork board, small slips of paper, form, form, "Steckbrief" (Profile)

Description:

The part of Katarína Löffrelová's life we have taken from when she returned home to Bratislava on 22 May 1945 and started looking for her surviving family members. On the bulletin board in the Homecomers' Office, she finds the people her relatives are looking for, including herself.

Task 1: Fill in a form "Steckbrief" (Profile), in Hungarian or in a foreign language (German), based on the information and life history you have received
